

Call for Proposals 2025 Resilient Virginia Conference Speakers

Summary

Resilient Virginia is a statewide nonprofit organization intent on moving resilience initiatives forward through education and activation.

On July 23-24, 2025, the organization is hosting their 6th biennial conference at James Madison University. This statewide conference will bring together resilience practitioners and researchers for peer to peer learning, networking, and collaborating.

At this time, Resilient Virginia is issuing a Call for Proposals (CFP) for conference speakers who can speak on moving Virginia forward in developing holistic, long-lasting state, regional, and community resilience.

Opportunity Details

This year's conference theme is **Moving Virginia Forward**. Past conferences have averaged between 200 and 300 attendees representing state, regional, and local governments, nonprofits, the private sector, and academia. Attendees work in a multitude of industries including governance, agriculture and food systems, water infrastructure, energy, transportation, emergency preparedness, built infrastructure, climate science, natural resource management, communications systems, land-use planning, public health, and many more.

Resilient Virginia is looking for presentations on innovative approaches to and perspectives on building resilience. Presentation ideas include (but are not limited to):

- Community programs where there is an opportunity for replication or scaling up
- Trans-boundary collaborations and/or partnerships
- Innovative approaches to building resilience
- Research projects
- Tools and resources for resilience practitioners
- Funding opportunities

All proposals must be submitted in PDF format.

- Outline of proposed presentation
- Links to where we can learn more (if applicable)

Length and Structure

Proposals should not exceed 3 pages

Selection Criteria

Evaluation Factors

Presentations will be evaluated on the following criteria:

- Alignment with Resilient Virginia's mission and goals
- Relevance to the current resilience landscape
- Likelihood of fostering collaborations or partnerships to bridge gaps in the current system
- Probability of building capacity to move resilience initiatives forward

Team or Panel

Proposals will be evaluated by a panel of Conference Advisory Committee Members and Resilient Virginia Staff.

Non-negotiables

- You must be available to present in-person at the conference in Harrisonburg, VA.
- You must present your own work or work you are authorized to speak about.

- Speakers are required to register for the conference. All speakers will receive a 25% discount on their registration.
- Resilient Virginia is a nonpartisan organization. Presentations should remain nonpartisan; submissions that favor a particular political party or affiliation will not be considered.
